Born in 1978, lives in Leipzig, Germany, in an apartment, with his girl friend Sandy Gabor and their daughter Sidney, 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> years old. For his living Tino runs a Taxi business with three cars.

### **Class 50+ Per Nisbeth DK**

#### Per Nisbeth

Born in 1959. Lives in Herning, DK, with his wife Lisbeth and their children Claus (21) and Pernille (18). For his living Per works as a plumber. He started riding Motocross in 1975 on a Husqvarna 125cc, and the year after on a Maico 250cc. In 1977 Per won the Danish National Championship for juniors. He was lucky to have a determined coach at that time of his career, which lead to qualification for Grand Prix 500cc in 1978 to 1983, and racing against riders like Roger de Coster, Brad Lackey, Heiki Mikkola and David Thorpe! Per continued with hard training and racing until 1984, when the family was started

In 1999 Per started riding in the Old-boys class for modern bikes, but in fact he wanted to ride old classic bikes. 2001 he bought a Maico 400cc -72 and won the Danish National Championship for Pre'-74 bikes.

For this year he bought a Husqvarna 500cc for the CETSC, and he sais "My victory in the CETSC 50+ class is the biggest championship I've ever won. I'm very pleased with all the help I've had on my way to this victory. The help and support I've had from my family and old colleagues are priceless and I couldn't have done it without them!"
